How to Collect a Hair Sample

Pulling hair is very easy.

FOLD BACKWARDS HERE

Pull 40-50 hairs from the horse's mane, by the roots, from the withers. **DO NOT** touch the roots. Twist 20, or so, hairs around a finger, about an inch away from the skin and pull straight out. Repeat the process, if needed. **DO NOT CUT THE HAIRS FROM YOUR HORSE!** Handle the hairs by the shaft. Long shafts of hair are not necessary, as DNA is extracted from the roots. For very young foals, hair from the tail is preferred, as it has larger root bulbs.


DO NOT PUT HAIR IN A PLASTIC BAG OR SEPARATE ENVELOPE
